Career Connections 8th Grade Career Fair

Today our eighth graders traveled to Players Choice in Appleton for the annual Career Fair sponsored by the Career Connections. Each student had the opportunity to visit three different Career Clusters to speak with workers in those areas. We were scheduled from 9:20-10:30 along with 830 other eighth graders from the Fox Valley.

Your eighth grader also had the opportunity to participate in another on-line interest and skills inventory program called Kuder. This is being offered to your child free of charge with our connection to the Junior Achievement program.

Lent

As we enter Holy Week (Palm Sunday is this weekend), we continue our Lenten Journey as a faith community through participation in prayer, fasting and almsgiving. We will pray as a school community at the beginning of every day next week. We will also have a day of retreat and reflection on Holy Thursday.

On Holy Thursday morning we will watch *The Chronicles of Narnia* with a follow-up discussion on all the imagery and analogies to the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ as well as the conflict of good and evil. The pre and post discussions will be lead by the religion teachers at each grade level.

In the afternoon, students will rotate between 5 stations designed to help them meditate on these very holy days of Lent. The rotations will include praying the sorrowful mysteries of the rosary, learning about the symbols of the Seder, meditation on a clip from *Jesus of Nazareth*, learning specifics about the three days of Triduum and participating in a prayer service called "the Five Wounds of Christ". Be sure to ask your child about all the special activities, discussions and prayers they will be part if that day.

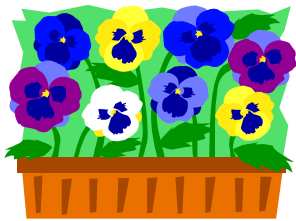
