SMC REBOOTS TECHNOLOGY WITH ONE-TO-ONE LAPTOP PROGRAM

It is true that today's students face challenges and enjoy opportunities that their parents never dreamed of. To meet these challenges and opportunities head on, SMC has taken one big step forward. Last year, after careful planning and research by staff members, the TCCES Board of Trustees approved a plan to make SMC the first high school in Northeast Wisconsin with a one-to-one laptop program.

The laptops are being integrated into SMC's already strong curriculum to enhance the learning environment for our students. At the start of the 2010-2011 school year, the freshman students received their laptops, and sophomores and juniors will receive them at the beginning of the second semester.

Putting a laptop in the hands of each student is just one component of a successful one-to-one program. Another essential element is quality, thorough teacher training. SMC faculty has been in training throughout the summer and will continue to learn how to maximize use of the laptops and technology.

SMC is funding this program through restricted donations. Many supporters have already made donations or pledges. The commitment of these future-minded individuals has allowed SMC to complete the infrastructure upgrades needed to provide wireless Internet throughout the school building and to purchase the teachers' laptops for the start of this school year.

ALUMNI MAKING A DIFFERENCE

Jim Cummings '82

It seems destiny that brought Jim Cummings to become founder and president of Kijana Educational Empowerment Initiative (KEEI).



It started after Cummings graduated from Macalester College in 1986 and went directly to serve with WorldTeach in Kenya for a year. It was from this point that he knew he could not walk away from this country in need of better educational opportunities.

He says, "My WorldTeach experience was a pivotal time in my life providing me with lifelong friends both in Kenya and in the U.S. and brought focus to my career goals."

Following this, Cummings taught at The Prairie School in Racine for four years and then at The

Benjamin School in North Palm Beach, Florida. It was at the Benjamin School that he was able to launch several initiatives with Kenya, eventually leading to formation of KEEI.

KEEI is a service organization that works to improve and restore basic school infrastructure in schools throughout Kenya by providing basic academic resources to students. It also helps finance orphaned students with scholarships to attend school. Since 1998, KEEI has raised tens of thousands of dollars since to create partnerships between Kenyan and American citizens.

KEEI has also built connections between students at schools in Kenya with students in the United States through pen-pal initiatives.

Much of the work for KEEI is done from Cummings' home office in North Palm Beach. Committees are in place and meetings and receptions are held in several cities around the United States each year to raise funds for the initiative. In addition, Cummings makes the 20 hour trip to Kenya two to three times each year to work with his committee there and to make sure projects are moving forward.

Jim Cummings has amazingly dedicated his life to building schools and empowering youth in rural Kenya. He credits his Catholic upbringing and his experiences at Camp Manito-wish (YMCA in Boulder Junction, Wisconsin) for giving him the compassion and skills necessary to carry out this mission.

Recently, Cummings was nominated for GQ magazine's *Better Men Better World Search*, an award which recognizes men who strive every day for the betterment of society through charitable work, volunteerism, and community involvement. Nancy (Wickeham) Krupa '57

Works with physically disabled children as a volunteer for the Minneapolis-based *We Can Ride* program. Founded in 1982, the program offers therapeutic horseback riding and carriage driving to adults and children living with disabilities.

About the experience, Krupa says, "It is awesome (like the kids say) to see the positive changes in these children from week to week. They would become physically stronger and some who had difficulty speaking were giving the one word commands to their horses. Such a great program!" Krupa worked as a groomer and side walker and now volunteers as a greeter for the program.

Sister Miranda taught in Milwaukee, Detroit, Burlington, Menasha and Marshfield. Upon retirement, Sister Miranda returned to Elm Grove. She did not, however, retire, as she continued to teach at a school across the road from the convent until she was 80 years old!
