Dear TCCES Friends and Families:

As we are getting settled into the new school year, it is an appropriate time to reflect on the blessings, opportunities and successes of the 2009-2010 school year.

TCCES has accomplished or set the groundwork for attaining the goals set forth by the original *TCCES: Planning our Future* strategic plan. Significant areas of improvement include Catholic identity and staff development. The adoption of a Catholic identity statement, increased sacraments and establishment of three new awards for faculty and staff (see story on page seven) as well as the number of teachers who took advantage of continuing education opportunities are examples of new growth in these areas.

Our administrators work diligently to control expenses while continuing to work with faculty and staff to provide outstanding educational opportunities and faith-filled experiences. The entire community shares enthusiasm for the administrative leadership and growth at St. Mary Central, as well as the excitement generated by preparation for the unique one-to-one laptop program. Advances in the area of technology are being experienced at the four other TCCES campuses as well, and this growth is targeted to continue into the future.

The TCCES board is moving toward a new phase of planning and growth. Now known as the TCCES Board of Trustees, this group of leaders is shifting from an emphasis on the day-to-day matters in the school to more appropriately focus on areas such as increasing visibility and communication, facilitating fundraising (particularly third-source fundraising) for the system and developing growth opportunities. Targeted growth opportunities include technology, enrollment, parish relationships, facilities, marketing and a continued focus on Catholic Identity. In addition, an active and enthusiastic development committee has been established that has detailed plans to work toward developing third source funds and community support.

Significant issues that face our system continue to be growing our foundations and scholarship funds to ensure that we can continue to fund tuition assistance at current levels, and continuing to strengthen our balance sheet through debt reduction. These are two goals that remain at the top of our board's focus as we transition to 2010-2011.

Jumbo Gumbo reached a new level of success in 2009 and promises to be an even greater event in 2010 in terms of the numbers of donors, participants and income raised. The gala Zephyrfest event celebrated its 25th anniversary with a highly successful and memorable evening. Third source funding opportunities such as these are becoming increasingly critical, and an area on which the board will continue to focus.


Bob Andersen has assumed the role of board chair for 2010-2011. Bob's leadership will keep the board, administration and system on the path of growth.

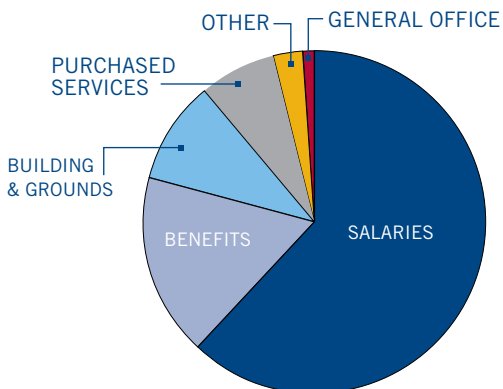
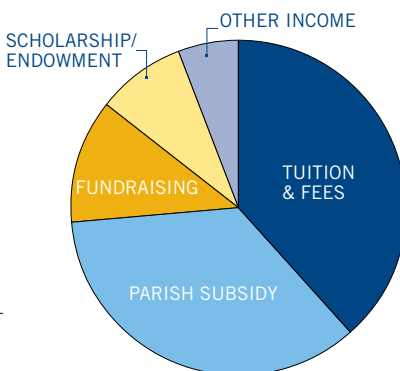
TCCES SUMMARY OF FINANCIAL DATA

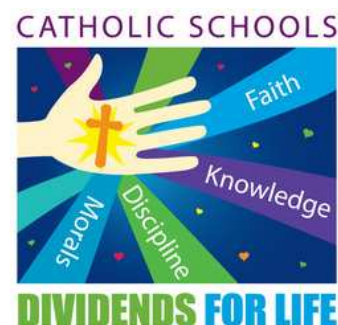

REFINED ROLE FOR TCCES BOARD

As the system and the Green Bay Diocese continue to grow and evolve, a new role for the TCCES board has emerged. In conjunction with a shift from emphasis on the day-to-day matters in the schools, the entity took a new name as of August 2009—the TCCES Board of Trustees. This board is composed of all of the pastors from the Neenah-Menasha parishes and members selected and appointed by the board's governance committee, with care taken to create a balance of representation from our parishes and various constituencies. The TCCES Board of Trustees reports to the Diocesan Corporate Board, the ultimate governing board, each year in March.

The primary areas of focus for the TCCES Board of Trustees include increasing visibility and communication, hiring and evaluating the system president, facilitating fundraising (particularly third-source fundraising) for the system and developing growth opportunities. Targeted growth opportunities include technology, enrollment, parish relationships, facilities, marketing and a continued focus on Catholic Identity.

Curriculum and educational issues are the responsibility of the schools led by the individual school principals. Each principal

works closely with and under the direction of the system president, who is responsible for keeping the board informed.

Terms of service for the TCCES Board of Trustees are three years, with a maximum of two consecutive terms (six consecutive years). The board meets on the third Wednesday of every month, except July.

The TCCES Corporate Board of Directors is composed of the bishop, two diocesan representatives, the Neenah-Menasha pastors and two elected parish representatives, the chairperson of the TCCES Board of Trustees and the system president. This board meets once a year to review progress, set goals and adopt the budget for the upcoming fiscal year.

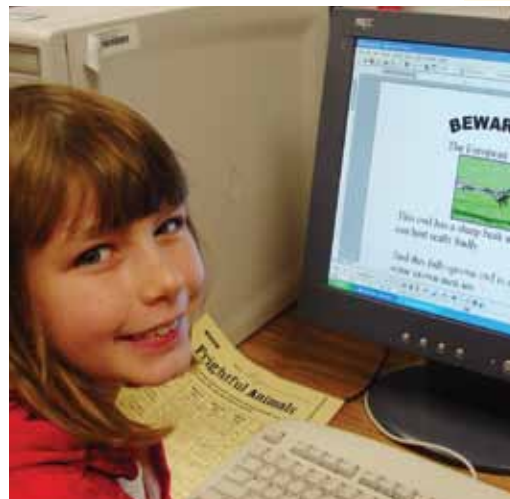

TECHNOLOGY TIDAL WAVE

The 2009-10 school year was an extremely busy one in the area of technology at all of the TCCES schools, as the system positioned itself as a leader among Fox Cities schools in using technology to enhance its strong curriculum. "Being literate in today's society not only applies to reading and writing but also technology use," says TCCES President Michael Sullivan. "It is extremely important that our students know how to properly use current technology. In order to do that, we are embracing new and innovative ways to incorporate technology into our strong curriculum at every level. This commitment to excellence in academics positions our students for success today and in the future.



- At the elementary campuses, new hardware and equipment were installed in the computer labs at each location, and data projectors and speakers were added to many classrooms.
- At Seton, a wireless network was installed throughout the building and the server was rebuilt, improving Internet access. Data projectors and interactive whiteboards (SMARTboards) were installed and used throughout the year.
- At St. Mary Central, preparing for the laptop program was the focus this year in the areas of infrastructure, hardware, software and teacher preparation and training.
- Teachers from all five campuses, particularly the high school, participated in extensive workshops and training sessions to prepare them to capitalize on their new capabilities.

Each school has developed its own technology plan, and parent-organized fundraisers will play a significant role in financing these projects. Three of the five campuses now have wireless capabilities. Data projectors, interactive white boards and laptops are already being used or are planned for every campus. With the successful implementation of the laptop program for freshmen at the high school, things are on track for sophomores and juniors to receive their computers in January 2011.

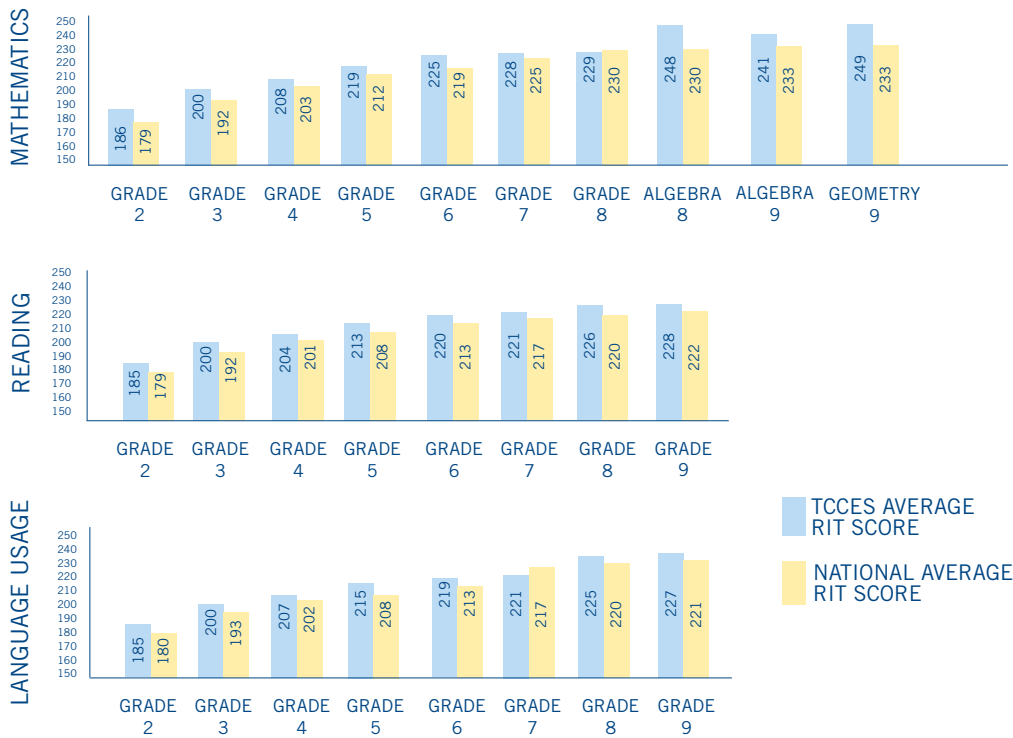

TCCES STUDENTS ACHIEVE OUTSTANDING RESULTS IN ACADEMIC TESTING

During the 2009-2010 school year, TCCES used the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) tests to track the scholastic progress of all TCCES students in grades 2-9. These computer-based assessments are administered in the fall and spring of each school year in the areas of reading, mathematics and language. Among other advantages, MAP tests: 1) allow parents and teachers to compare how their student(s) as individuals perform in relation to other students nationwide, 2) assist teachers in identifying specific students' educational needs, and 3) help administrators identify within the curriculum both strengths and areas in need of improvement. The assessments are also valuable in monitoring students' progress and growth from the beginning to the end of the school year, as well as determining what materials may need to be reviewed following the summer break.

One important measurement is the students' scores in comparison with those of the 4-million other students across the country that took the MAP tests in 2009-2010. The results are calculated as an RIT (Rasch UnIT) score, which is a curriculum scale that uses questions of increasing difficulty to estimate student achievement. The RIT scale is characterized by its administering agency as an accurate, equal-interval achievement scale that measures growth over time and has the same meaning regardless of a student's age or grade level.

2009-10 TCCES MAP SCORES



TCCES students' increase in mastery in the areas of reading, mathematics and language from the beginning to the end of the 2009-2010 school year was significant. At every grade level and in each subject area, average student achievement scores increased, often as much as 13 points. In the area of mathematics, the average increase was 10 points; in reading, 7; and in language usage, 7.4. TCCES is pleased with the transition to MAP testing because of its capacity to determine individual students' needs and to help in curriculum evaluation and planning. Administrators, teachers and parents are also proud of TCCES students' level of achievement in these evaluations.
